JOHN 15. 9-17

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Saint John.

Jesus said to his disciples:
As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments

and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

‘This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one’s life for one’s friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

TODAY'S READINGS

ACTS 10. 44-48

The Holy Spirit falls on the Gentiles who have heard Peter preach in Caesarea. Peter sees this as a sign that all who believe in Jesus may be baptised into the faith.

I JOHN 5. 1-6

John meditates on the love of God and the response of faith as testified by the Spirit, that leads to "the victory that overcomes the world".

JOHN 15. 9-17

Jesus speaks to his disciples not as servants but as friends. They are to abide in his love and obey his command to love one another.
