Millie, her parents and godparents come to the front of the Church, the rest of the congregation sits down

The priest addresses the whole congregation

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'.

We thank God for Millie as she begins the journey of faith.

So I ask you all:

Will you support Millie as she begins the journey of faith? **We will.**

Will you help her to live and grow within God's family? **We will.**

The priest then addresses the parents and godparents God knows each of us by name and we are his. Parents and godparents, you speak for Millie today. Will you pray for her, and help her to follow Christ?

We will.

OPENING PRAYER (THE COLLECT)

God, our light and our salvation: shine in all our lives, that we may see your goodness in the land of the living, and looking on your beauty may be changed into the likeness of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Reading – Hebrews 5. 1-10

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Every high priest is chosen from his fellow-men and appointed to serve God on their behalf, to offer sacrifices and offerings for sins. Since he himself is weak in many ways, he is able to be gentle with those who are ignorant and make mistakes. And because he is himself weak, he must offer sacrifices not only for the sins of the people but also for his

own sins. No one chooses for himself the honour of being a high priest. It is only by God's call that a man is made a high priest - just as Aaron was.

In the same way, Christ did not take upon himself the honour of being a high priest. Instead, God said to him, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father." He also said in another place, "You will be a priest forever, in the priestly order of Melchizedek." In his life on earth Jesus made his prayers and requests with loud cries and tears to God, who could save him from death. Because he was humble and devoted, God heard him. But even though he was God's Son, he learned through his sufferings to be obedient. When he was made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all those who obey him, and God declared him to be high priest, in the priestly order of Melchizedek.

For the word of the Lord thanks be to God.

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Saint Mark. Glory to you, O Lord.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus. "Teacher," they said, "there is something we want you to do for us." "What is it?" Jesus asked them. They answered, "When you sit on your throne in your glorious Kingdom, we want you to let us sit with you, one at your right and one at your left." Jesus said to them, "You don't know what you are asking for. Can you drink the cup of suffering that I must drink? Can you be baptized in the way I must be baptized?" "We can," they answered. Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink the cup I must drink and be baptized in the way I must be baptized. But I do not have the right to choose who will sit at my right and my left. It is God who will give these places to those for whom he has prepared them." When the other ten disciples heard about it, they became angry with James and John. So Jesus called them all together to him and said, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the heathen have power over them, and the leaders have complete authority. This, however, is not the way it is among you. If one of you wants to be great, you must be the servant of the rest; and if one of you wants to be first, you must be the slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served; he came to serve and to give his life to redeem many people."

Parents and Godparents gather around the FONT with the Priest

The Decision

The priest addresses the candidate and parents and godparents

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcome us home. In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? I do.

Do you reject evil? I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I do.

Do you trust him as Lord? I do.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The sign of the cross is made on the forehead of each child who is to be baptized

Millie, Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross ▶.

Do not be ashamed of Christ.
You are his for ever.
Stand bravely with him
against all the powers of evil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

THE BLESSING OF THE WATER

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus.

At his baptism in the River Jordan you poured your Spirit on him.

He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him.

And so, Father, we ask you to ▶ bless this water, that those who are baptized in it may be cleansed in the water of life, filled with your Spirit and know themselves loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. **Amen.**

Let us affirm, together with this child who is being baptised, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world? **I believe and trust in him.**

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The priest baptizes the child, saying:

Millie Rose, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The priest anoints the child on the crown of the head with the Oil of Chrism, saying:

May God, who has received you by baptism into His Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

A baptismal candle is given to the newly baptized child:

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light. You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life. Shine as a light in the world, to the glory of God the Father.

Millie, today God has touched you with his love, and you are now a member of his family, the Church. God promises to be with you in good times and bad, to be your guide in life, and to bring you safely to heaven. Today is only the beginning! You are on a lifelong journey with God, together with all God's people, to grow in faith, to find out all you can about Jesus and grow in friendship with God and in love for all people, so living out the life of Jesus in the world today.

Lord of all life, you created the universe, where all living things reflect your glory. You give us this great and beautiful earth, to discover and to cherish.

You give us happy times and things to celebrate. In these we taste your kingdom, a feast for all your children.

You made us all, each wonderfully different, to join with the angels and sing your praise:

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. We thank you, loving Father, because, when we turned away, you sent Jesus, your Son.
He gave his life for us on the cross and shows us the way to live.

Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine may be for us Christ's body and his blood.

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen, Jesus took bread. He gave thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples, saying:

'This is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.'

After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying:

'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.'

So Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these gifts, send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour.

Help us, Father, to love one another, as we look forward to that day when suffering is ended, and all creation is gathered in your loving arms.

And now with all your saints we give you glory, through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit, today and for ever. **Amen.**
