Harvest Thanksgiving



Today we celebrate Harvest Thanksgiving. Our first reading tells us that people in Old Testament times were instructed to bring offerings to God at harvest-time.

In the time of Jesus, the Feast of Weeks (Shavout) marked the first-fruits of the harvest and the Feast of Ingathering (Sukkot) marked the end of the harvest.

The modern Harvest Festival was introduced in Cornwall in 1843 by Reverend Robert Hawker, Vicar of Morwenstow. Most churches now hold a Harvest Thanksgiving service around the beginning of October. It is a time to say "thank you" to God for all the good things which which we are blessed, and also to think about how we care for God's creation and how we share what we have more fairly.














Harvest Picture Crossword
