

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Saint Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

He is the Word made flesh. Through him you give to the eye of faith a new vision of your glory; you reveal your perfect love, and invite us to love and worship you, the unseen God.

Therefore, with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we praise your glorious name:

Christ will come in glory.

Therefore, loving God, recalling now the sacrifice of Christ your Son once for all upon the cross and the triumph of his resurrection, we ask you to accept this our sacrifice of praise.

Send your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts that we may be fed with the body and blood of your Son and be filled with his life and goodness.
Unite us in Christ and give us your peace that we may do your work and be his body in the world.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**
